

# What is the NSP?

The South African National Strategic Plan on HIV, TB and STIs 2017 - 2022 (NSP) is a roadmap for the next stage of our journey towards a future where these three epidemics are firmly under control. This plan sets out the destinations – or goals - of our shared journey and establishes landmarks in the form of specific measurable objectives.

The purpose of the NSP is to enable the many thousands of organisations and individuals who drive the response to HIV, TB and STIs to work together, moving in the same direction.

# Who developed the NSP?

The process of writing the NSP was guided and coordinated by the South African National AIDS Council (SANAC) which represents all national and provincial governments, civil society organisations, trade unions, private sector bodies and faith-based organisations that are working to reverse these epidemics. SANAC structures also include the country's top researchers and experts on HIV, TB and STIs, as well as international development partners.



# NSP GOALS

The NSP sets out eight major goals and a host of specific objectives and interventions to support the achievement of these goals.

GOAL 1



Accelerate prevention to reduce new HIV, TB and STI infections.

**“Breaking the Cycle of Transmission”**

GOAL 2



Reduce morbidity and mortality by providing treatment, care and adherence support for all.

**“90-90-90 in Every District”**

GOAL 3



Reach all key and vulnerable populations with comprehensive, customised and targeted interventions.

**“Nobody Left Behind”**

GOAL 4



Address the social and structural drivers of HIV, TB and STI infections.

**“A multi department multi sector approach”**

# NSP GOALS

GOAL 5



Ground the response to HIV, TB and STIs in human rights principles and approaches.

**“Equal Treatment and Social Justice”**

GOAL 6



Promote leadership at all levels and shared accountability for a sustainable response to HIV, TB and STIs.

**“Mutual Accountability”**

GOAL 7



Mobilise resources to support the achievement of NSP goals and ensure a sustainable response.

**“Spend Now, Save Later”**

GOAL 8



Strengthen strategic information to drive progress towards achievement of NSP goals.

**“Data-Driven Action”**

**If we want to succeed, we have to make our actions count to reach the goals of our NSP. What can you do in your community to let your actions count?**



Take care of yourself and your family and reduce your risk of getting HIV, TB and STIs.



Protect young women and girls from getting HIV.



Pay special attention to youth, orphans and vulnerable children and people with disabilities.



Act against gender-based and sexual violence.



Check your HIV status regularly so that you can stay negative or get care to remain healthy.



If you have HIV do everything you can to stay on your treatment for always and join a group of other people living with HIV.



Get screened for TB if you have a cough that is not going away or if you know someone who has TB.



If you have TB make sure you finish your treatment so that you can be cured.



Help to reduce stigma and discrimination against people with HIV or TB and protect their human rights.



Join community organisations working to overcome HIV, TB and STIs and that reach and empower people who have higher risk behaviours and/or legal and social issues that increase their vulnerability.



Encourage your community to participate in prevention activities and help others to access health and social development services.
